



Campus Internships for FUTURE Program Participants

An internship is a form of experiential learning that integrates a PhD scholar's academic and research experience with practical application and skills development in a professional setting. Internships allow PhD scholars to gain valuable applied experience and make connections in professional fields they are considering for career paths, and give employers the opportunity to guide and evaluate talent. Internships may vary from 4-40 hours per week, are paid or unpaid and typically range from 10-12 weeks during the summer or throughout the academic year.
